





Vacant nursing posts compromise the safety and quality of care that patients receive, and health outcomes $^{\rm ix}$



4. High COVID-19 infection rates

The UK is experiencing the highest total number of cases of COVID-19 in Europe (9,448,402 as of 11 November 2021)^{xiv}. The data is collected for international comparison and as such is UK wide. The UK Government's latest COVID-19 data (as of 11 November 2021) shows 42,408 daily cases. The latest data in for England shows 35,472 new cases for 11 November 2021.^{xv}








6. NHS elective / community waiting times


The 'backlog' of people requiring elective care and treatment due to delays in the pandemic is becoming more evident. Latest figures from NHS England**xvi* show that the number of people waiting to start consultant-led elective treatment has risen to a total of 5.8 million people at the end of September 2021, the highest number since records began in August 2007. This is nearly two and half times more than the 2.3 million patients when the waiting list was at its shortest in January 2009**xviii* and is the equivalent of around one in 10 of the English population waiting to start treatment.**xxiiii




Internationally qualified nursing staff have always played a vital role in the UK's health and care services, and in improving the health and wellbeing of the population. The RCN very






10. Increased demand for social care services

There is widespread recognition that the formal adult social care sector in England has faced multiple challenges over many years. Many organisations have consistently highlighted these key challenges over a long period of time. In England, social care services have experienced years of underfunding, despite continued increasing population need. The population aged over 65 in England is projected to increase by 49% (to 14.9 million) by 2041 and the fastest increase will be seen in the 85 years and over age group.xlii
